"I graduated from SSU in 2020 with a bachelors of science in nursing and minor in women's health. While in undergrad I worked at the LARC as a peer tutor, supplemental instruction leader and lead tutor. My favorite part of working at the LARC was all the amazing people that I got to meet, both my coworkers and students I tutored. The greatest challenge that I encountered while working there was that at first I felt like I needed to have all the answers right off the top of my head or I was a bad tutor. However, I learned that it actually can be helpful to model for my students how to find information you don't know. As a nurse, patient education is a huge part of my job and working at the LARC has definitely helped me in this area. I love being able to explain things to patients in a way that they are able to understand. Right now I am working as a registered nurse at a full scope women's health clinic. #### About Dr. Nadiyah Parekh:

Nadiya Parekh is an Assistant Professor, Management & Social Entrepreneurship at the School of Business & Economics, Sonoma State University. She was educated at the management schools of Indian Institute of Technology, Madras and National Institute of Technology, Calicut. After her doctoral studies she worked as Assistant Professor in Social Entrepreneurship academia in India. Later she worked in the impact investment industry in the United States in the research and analytics domain before starting her current role at SSU. As a faculty trained in business who has consciously chosen to step away from that industry's focus on maximizing wealth for the wealthy, her research and practice has been on exploring how with a sustainable mindset business can be more inclusive. Her teaching brings this transformation in business into action by collaborating with young and creative minds at SSU who care to make a difference in our community.

#### How did your partnership with the LARC help your students?

My partnership with LARC has helped my students realize that the evaluation rubric for their writing intensive business capstone project report was not designed for assessment purposes alone but to help them experience the 'power of clarity' amidst 'business uncertainty'. For their capstone project/BUS491, students workshop with LARC tutors to get an external yet expert view on their draft reports and ensure that their write-up meets the logical clarity expected in a strategic argument. Following the workshop, students are given opportunities to strengthen the evidence for their strategic argument. I notice that once students experience the clarity gained in a learning-through-writing-approach and know that a friendly community exists at LARC to support them with this skill, writing often becomes like a meditative experience. In both meditation and writing, it's hard to find the 'flow' and it only happens with repeated practice. Having a dedicated center on campus to focus on this practice matters.

Your favorite place on campus or favorite place in Sonoma County? Children's book section at the SSU library What would you want the Sonoma State community to know about you? Nothing empowers like education that cares for our community and I'm living that experience here at SSU.

Nadiyah Parekh has written two books: <u>"Social Enterprises – Cases and Analysis for</u> <u>Understanding Social Business</u>"and <u>"Sustainability of Indian Microfinance Institutions: A Mixed</u> <u>Methods Approach</u>". She also co-edited a book titled <u>"Technology and Innovation for Social</u> <u>Change"</u>.
